### **OUR NEEDS**

Our Lady of Victory School needs more space. We have been blessed with a large school family, one that strains to fit inside our school buildings. Each class and grade are nearing capacity, and our breezeways and common areas are congested and busy. Our curriculum and the academic opportunities we can offer are maximized within the available space. We need more room to continue to provide an exemplary Catholic education to our children, grandchildren and future generations. Without more space, we could be forced to turn away students and families, which could result in our community losing generations and families in Catholic education.

# OUR VISION: Promoting Individualized Student Attention and Creating New Learning Spaces

Recognizing our space limitations, we plan to alleviate overcrowding on our campus and in each classroom. Since our school's beginning, we have offered small class sizes to ensure students are supported though the learning journey. Although blessed with a strong enrollment, we must radically address the lack of space, scheduling headaches, noise and congestion that trouble our current campus. Reducing the number of students in each classroom will go a long way toward empowering students to spread their wings.

Working toward this vision, we plan to renovate the second level of the Cathedral Center into a new junior high, thus continuing the vision that started more than a decade ago with the purchase of the Town & Country Mall. A designated junior high will allow OLV to distribute each grade's students, PK-8, into smaller class sizes by increasing the number of sections per-grade from two to three. This intentional de-densifying of the current campus promotes a better student-teacher ratio and ensures individualized attention and support.

Transforming the Cathedral Center into a junior high will require thoughtful planning and a lot of work, but the space we create will benefit our school and parish community for generations to come. The 24,000-square-foot space will open to our 6th, 7th, and 8th graders in August 2025. The new junior high will include:

- Nine spacious classrooms, including a state-of-the-art science lab with lab sinks
- A 4,700-square-foot commons space for group assemblies, presentations and meals.
- Office space, a teachers' workroom and storage space.
- Chapel for reflection, reconciliation, and classroom Mass.
- Accessible and abundant restroom facilities.
- An elevator, three renovated stairwells, and numerous additional safety features

The learning spaces created on campus and in the Cathedral Center will propel OLV to develop the curriculum in new ways and provide our children with opportunities, particularly enhancing STEM, the arts, religion and the ability to identify student learning needs more immediately. The state-of-the-art junior high educational environment will offer students more independence and spaces to learn, mature and evolve from children into young men and women.
